When 8-year-old Alan Kim won a Golden Globe for his role in the critically acclaimed film Minari, the young actor’s happy tears touched many people’s hearts. He stars alongside Walking Dead actor Steven Yeun in the powerful, heartwarming drama by award-winning writer-director Lee Isaac Chung. Minari tells the story of a Korean family who move to a rural Arkansas during the 1980s. The film, which aired at Sundance Film Festival, has been met with critical acclaim, so how can viewers in the UK watch Minari?Sadly, we have some time to wait before Minari reaches UK shores. It’s currently available in the U.S. via virtual cinema platform A24, Amazon Prime, and iTunes, but it’s not yet ready to stream over here.However, Minari has been given a release date of April 2, 2021, which is when it will be available to see in the UK and Irish cinemas (all dependent on restrictions, of course).Given all the industry buzz, Minari seems to be worth the wait.The film also stars Ayeri Han, Will Patton, and celebrated Korean actor Yuh-Jung Youn. It sees the Korean American family move to an Arkansas farm in search of its own American dream and, naturally, they experience some challenges “in the strange and rugged Ozarks.”The story is based on director Chung’s personal experience of moving to Arkansas from Korea as a child. For the director, Minari is a means of “reclaiming the American Dream.”However, Chung’s film was deemed ineligible for Best Picture at the Golden Globes, and was instead nominated in the Foreign Language Film category despite the film having an American production company (A24 and Plan B Entertainment), American director (Chung), and American lead (Steven Yeun, who has also been passed over for any solo nominations). The controversial snub has seen widespread criticism. Meanwhile, the film’s actors have praised Chung for his vision. “He captured the feeling of what a family is like, of what marriage feels like, what growing up in a religious household feels like. . . there are so many things that I could relate to with Isaac,” praised actor Steven Yeun, via Deadline. “I hadn’t seen many tellings of stories of the other done in a way that wasn’t idealising them or romanticising them or needing them to be afflicted by some external force that validates their existence.” It’s likely that this year you’ll be seeing in 2021 in a bit more of a chilled out way. Great TV and a cup of something festive has been crucial over the last few weeks and that shows no signs of changing anytime soon. If you’re a fan of scandalous period dramas then you’re in luck. UK viewers can watch The Great on Channel 4 on Jan. 3 at 9 p.m and on the channel’s catch up service All 4, thereafter.Creators have noted that The Great is based on fact “sort of.” The first episode will introduce viewers to Elle Fanning as Catherine the Great before she became Empress to Russia. Catherine the Great was a formidable ruler between 1762 to 1796. She was married to Peter of Holstein-Gottorp (played by Nicholas Hoult), the Emperor of Russia. Their marriage was rocky at best with many rumours of affairs and misbehaviour, but Catherine sure had a way of dealing with her enemies. Just six months into his reign, she organised for his opponents to overthrow him. She then began 34 years in charge.In the magnificent palace that Catherine calls home, are servants who do her bidding and meddle in her business (and that of the country’s) including Marial, played by Phoebe Fox, who has a hand in the Emperor’s undoing. The setting and costumes for this series may look whimsical but the drama that lays beneath will have you gripped.Fans of Hoult will be used to seeing him flouncing around in a wig after his part in The Favourite. The Great isn’t the first time Fanning and Hoult have worked alongside each other as a married couple. They also starred in Jake Paltrow’s The Young Ones together.In an interview with Refinery29 about the series and her role, Fanning said: “I’m obviously a young woman. I felt a lot like Catherine, honestly. The whole series is about her finding her strength and her power, and learning how to use them. She doesn’t always use it in the right way, she makes mistakes, which is what’s intriguing to me about her. And she has a bit of arrogance and an ego, which I really love. She doesn’t apologise for it, which is a nice thing to see on screen.”You can watch The Great in the UK on Jan 3, at 9 p.m. on Channel 4. This article was originally published on May 26, 2020 Hollywood heavyweights Denzel Washington, Rami Malek, and Jared Leto star in the crime film, The Little Things — an undeniably strong line-up. Directed by John Lee Hancock, the crime thriller sees Kern County Deputy Sheriff Joe “Deke” Deacon (played by Washington) sent to Los Angeles on a simple assignment before he becomes embroiled in the search for a serial killer. The film first aired on HBO Max in the US in January 2021, yet how to watch The Little Things in the UK? The good news, The Little Things is now available to rent across various platforms in the UK, including Amazon, Sky, Apple TV, and Google Play. Speaking to People, Hancock said: “I think moviegoers will appreciate the unexpected twists and turns of the story, the themes as well as the plot and, of course, the outstanding performances by Denzel, Rami, and Jared, as well as the rest of the cast.”Jared Leto earned himself a Golden Globe 2021 nomination for his role as Albert Sparma, the case’s main suspect. No stranger to playing and challenging characters, Leto admitted that he has “walked on the darker side of the universe” throughout much of his career. Speaking to BBC, he said: “there was a moment where I did think, I’ve kind of walked on the darker side of the universe a lot in my career, maybe it’s time to not do that again. But after seeing the opportunity here, I just couldn’t say no”. Leto also spoke about the privilege of working alongside such celebrated acting talent in The Little Things.Leto added: “Rami and Denzel have been great inspirations for me. Because when they work it’s head to toe. I mean, if you watch Denzel in his movies, his whole body is alive. And you know, that’s always the Holy Grail.”“If you look at Rami and what he did in Bohemian Rhapsody (his Oscar-winning turn as Freddie Mercury)... when I saw him the first time after that, I said, ‘Forget the acting, what you did on the stage, that... just deserves the awards in and of itself.” Mae Martin is the Canadian transplant leading the way for LGBTQ+ comedy and her new show Feel Good looks set to set screens alight. Martin plays Mae and Charlotte Ritchie stars as her girlfriend George.One of the aforementioned external factors is the overbearing love of Mae’s parents, especially her mum played by the one and only Lisa Kudrow of Friends fame. Kudrow spoke to Channel 4 about her role and said “I’m thrilled to be playing Linda but I first fell in love with Mae and the scripts she and Joe wrote.” Adding: “It’s sweet and very funny and awkward and well observed.”Kudos to Channel 4 and Netflix for continuing to nurture new talent, queer stories, and real life issues. Minari began streaming on most major platforms beginning on Friday, February 26, meaning you can rent it for \$20 on Amazon Prime or Google Play now. Alternatively, you can snag a \$20 ticket to daily virtual screenings via A24’s website and also gain exclusive access to a Q&A with the cast. Virtual screenings allow you to watch the movie during a specified four hour-window. (After that, the screening expires.)And, of course, there’s the ‘analog’ option: visiting your local movie theater. Just be sure to do an online search for your theater’s Covid-19 restrictions. As long as you can handle a more conventional television experience with periodic commercials, these services — which are often viewable on Roku, Amazon Fire and other streaming devices that can be plugged into your TV — offer a free and convenient way to watch your favorite shows. There are plenty of apps and websites out there that you can use to legally watch shows and movies of all kinds online. From the latest episodes of The Daily Show to your favorite 90s series, the television you want to see is out there, and it doesn’t have to cost a dime. While it’s true that you can watch videos posted by friends and family on social media sites, you’re missing out on a whole world of entertainment if you think that cat videos posted by your friends are all that’s out there (delightful though they may be). Facebook, for instance, has quietly gotten into the streaming game, and it’s home to a surprisingly broad range of content. More recent movies and shows tend to require a rental fee, but others, such as The King’s Speech, The Terminator, Mean Girls and more are all free to watch with ads. Just because you don’t have cable or satellite TV doesn’t mean that you can’t watch the shows on them. Many streaming sites host content from the big cable channels, but even if you don’t have a Netflix or Hulu subscription, you can often watch cable shows for free on the websites or apps of the channels that produced them. Comedy Central, for instance, hosts the latest episodes of many of its series at cc.com, including The Daily Show With Trevor Noah. Similarly, FX offers a selection of recent episodes from some of its shows, such as Archer, on its website. You can also sometimes find episodes of your favorite shows by visiting their websites directly. While there’s no guarantee, many local channels host special programming and recordings of local events online. Those who don’t want to pay for access to network TV at all still have a few options to consider. Hulu offers some network shows for free, although you gain access to vastly more content by paying for a subscription. Additionally, Crackle and Tubi TV offer free access to network television shows, both in the U.S. and abroad. With a mix of more familiar titles, such as Unsolved Mysteries and 3rd Rock From the Sun, as well as new series, like Snatch, Crackle provides a surprisingly diverse range of offerings for viewers to choose from. If you can’t find your favorite show there, however, there’s no shortage of other ad-supported free streaming services to choose from. Others that are worth your consideration include Tubi TV, VUDU, Crunchyroll (for anime fans), Plex, FilmRise, Pluto TV and more.
