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How to attach diffuser to hair dryer

Many people are familiar with the daily routine of washing, drying, and styling their hair. Although hair will eventually dry on its own if given enough time, most people reach for a hair dryer to speed up the process. While science may have disproven the link between wet heads and catching colds, it's still no fun to sit around with a head full of wet hair, especially in the winter. Hair dryers, also known as blow dryers, were first sold in the 1920s. At first they were pretty dangerous to use -- hundreds of people were electrocuted when they dropped their hair dryer into water-filled sinks and bathtubs. That isn't as likely today, however, because of the advent of Ground Fault Circuit Interrupters (GFCI). Since 1991, all portable hair dryers have been required by U.S. federal law to protect you against electrocution should you accidentally drop one in water while it's plugged in [source: CSPC]. This applies whether the hair dryer is on or off. A GFCI is the larger, polarized plug that you'll find on many consumer appliances. When they're plugged in, GFCIs monitor the amount of current that's running from one slot of a wall outlet through an electric circuit and back to the other slot. If they sense a leak in the current, they trip the circuit. (See How does a GFCI outlet work? for details). What happens to a hair dryer if you drop it in water when it's not plugged in? You don't run the risk of electrocution, since there's no source of current, but you can certainly damage the hair dryer if all of its components get wet. So, plugged in or not, it's a bad idea to throw it in the tub. Have you ever wondered what those components are inside a hair dryer that lets you blow hot air through your hair without burning your scalp? Keep reading to find out why you won't sizzle. Curly hair ain't nothing to trifle with. The spiral-y way it grows out of your hair looks beautiful, but ultimately, it's more fragile than straight hair and can get dry really easily. So when you've got curls and you're looking for a blow-dryer, you have to be extra selective. But finding the right tools for curly hair can be tricky. "A blow-dryer is the most invaluable asset in your beauty tool arsenal and is worth spending a little extra (research and) money on," explains New York City-based hairstylist Devin Toth of Salon SCK. "It's so important to find a high-quality, durable hair dryer that comes equipped with diverse heat settings and blow-dryer attachments that suit your specific hair needs." For starters, it should have multiple heat settings, as well as and a powerful airflow to dry tighter curls quickly, but not to the point of dry out or damage. As a shopping starting point, keep in mind that your blow-dryer is more about the tool itself and not just the attachment. You can easily replace a diffuser; you'd have to start over with the base if it conks out — and that's often a pricier purchase and requires a bit of research. Another major consideration for curly textures is whether you're looking to simply dry and define your curls or if you want to smooth your hair out into a blowout. This is where the attachments really come into play.
