
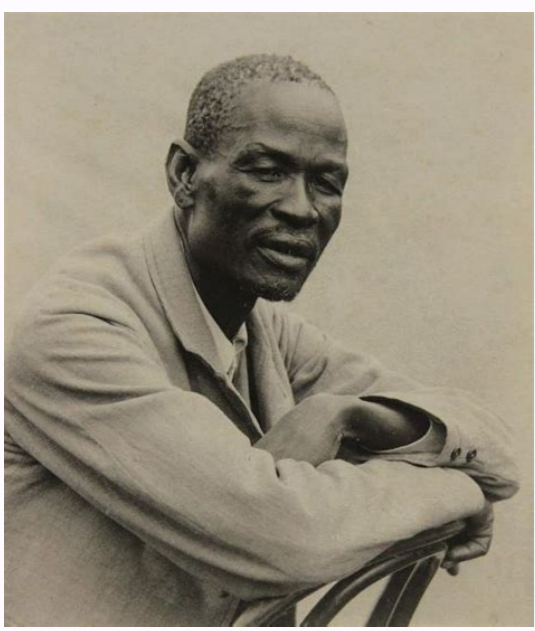

She is his sister-in-law and any intervention by him could be construed as undue interference.The then Minister of International Relations Lindiwe Sisulu travelled to Botswana in April 2019 to assure the South African government of continued support. In March 2021, Masisi visited Ramaphosa to lobby for support for his candidate, Elias Mpedi Magosi, to be appointed Executive Secretary of SADC. Government sources said South Africa supported him because his experience was superior to that of the Democratic Republic of the Congo candidate. Although former Public Protector Thuli Madonsela and Judge Dennis Davis have defended the integrity of Motsepe and Khama at different times, Khama felt that South African leaders could be more forthright against their peers who harass opposition politicians.
