How to Fill CBSE Class 10 Online Application for Private Candidate Here we have provided a step-by-step procedure for filling up the online CBSE Private Candidate application form 2021. Promotion guidelines of CBSE class 10 2021-22: CBSE has declared a set of guidelines for promotion to Class 11 that the schools need to follow. The guidelines are as follows: CBSE has asked the schools to refrain from streaming and let the students decide which all subjects to study based on their choice irrespective of Arts, Science, Commerce. Students can continue with Mathematics in class 11 as long as they had the subject in class 10 as well. Students are permitted to continue with class 11 even if they fail in class 10 board examinations. Students failing to qualify in the class 10 board exam will have to sit for a compartment exam and it will have an objective paper. Schools will be conducting the compartment exam, hence the decision lies on the school to decide whether it will be in the online/offline mode based on the situation. Exam Assessment Procedure for 2021: CBSE has canceled the Class 10 Board exams but the assessment for promotion of the students will be done on the basis of the prescribed guidelines mandated by the board. 30% will be Competency-Based questions which include MCQs, Case-Based questions, Source-Based Integrated questions, etc. 20% will be allotted for Objective type questions and the remaining 50% for short or long questions depending on the set guidelines. Increase in internal choices in the question paper: The number of questions has been increased in the CBSE question paper. There will be 33% of internal choice in all the sections of the question paper for all subjects. Now the students will have more options on which question to answer, to choose from. Introduction of Objective Type Questions: CBSE officials have now introduced Objective Type Questions in all the subjects in CBSE class 10th examinations. Now there will be 25% MCQs in each question paper for each subject, which means that out of the 60 marks assigned to the theory paper of a subject, 20 marks will be assigned to Objective Type Questions. Subjective questions will carry the remaining 60 marks. There will be a total of 6 types of Objective Type Questions: Multiple Response Multiple Choice Fill in the blanks Right and Wrong Assertion Matchmaking Change of pattern for internal assessment: Internal Assessment will be of 20 marks. The distribution of marks will be under the new pattern for the internal assessment. The marks distribution has been mentioned below: Type of Assessment Distribution of Marks Periodic Test 5 marks Multiple Assessments 5 marks Portfolio 5 marks Subject Enrichment Activities 5 marks Total 20 marks Periodic Test: 3 periodic tests will be conducted for each subject in the Class 10th examination. The average marks secured in 2 tests, based on best performance, will be taken for final submission from these three tests. This part will be carrying five marks in the annual exam for internal assessment. Multiple Assessments: The school will carry out this part under the internal assessment. Multiple assessments will be included in various types of tests such as Individual/Group assessment, Oral test, Activities, Graphics, projects, Maps, Assignments, etc. CBSE has given authority to the school officials to conduct these assessments. This part will carry five marks. Portfolio: The Portfolio of a student refers to the work done by that student. It also includes the progress, growth, accomplishments and achievements, efforts, etc. of a student. This part carries 5 marks. The portfolio of a student consists of the following elements: Design of work - Creativity, Neatness, Visual appeal Completion of guided work on specific curricular objectives Formation of all relevant work Knowledge/Knowledge-base Subject Enrichment Activities: This part has been added to evaluate the assessment of project works, practical, and language skills of a student. After the declaration of results, those candidates who are not satisfied with their marks can apply for revaluation or recheck of the answer sheet. In this process, the marks will be calculated again. The marks may increase or decrease during the process and no changes for decreased marks will be entertained under any circumstances. The application for revaluation shall be made on the official website. Students will have to submit the prescribed fee to complete the application process. CBSE Class 10 Improvement Exams 2021 CBSE Class X Improvement examinations will be held for students who didn't score as per expectation and want to improve their score. Students can fill the application form for the same in the month of October and November. The following are tentative dates for various exam activities. Students can go through the CBSE Class 10 Sample Papers for more practice to score higher in the improvement exams. Criteria to Apply For Improvement Exams: Improvement exam 2021 can be taken by candidates who passed the 2019 or 2021 CBSE Board exam More than one subject can be chosen by candidates for improvement. The application fee will depend on the number of subjects chosen. The best performance in the board exam or improvement exam will be taken into consideration while preparing the final scorecard. Students are advised to go through the eligibility criteria as per CBSE before applying for the improvement exam. If the candidate does not meet the eligibility criteria, his/her exam form will be canceled. Candidates who have passed the previous Board Exam they had appeared for; are eligible to give this exam. Candidates who are willing to change their previous marks are allowed to give the improvement exam. One must have studied from CBSE Board in Class XI and XII. Candidates with a compartment in any subject are not eligible. One can write an improvement exam for the subjects they previously appeared for only. Improvement exams can be given for subjects out of the five main subjects only. The best score in every subject from the Improvement and Board Exam will be considered while preparing the final scorecard. CBSE Class X (Result) 2020 in Trends CBSE class X results was declared in May. Students can check their results at the official website of CBSE cbseresults.nic.in Around 17,61,078 students appeared in the 2020 improvement exam out of which 16,04,428 students passed the exam leading to an overall pass percentage of 91.10% this year. The pass percentage for boys is 90.14%, while for girls is 92.45%. 94.74% transgender students passed the examination. CBSE Class 10 Compartment Exams 2021 CBSE Class 10 Compartment Exams 2021 will be conducted from August 25 to September 8, 2021. Compartment Exams will be conducted for Regular Students who could not pass Class 10 Board Exams in one two papers. As the results were prepared on the basis of internal assessments, students were graded on the basis of their performance in previous year examinations. Every year CBSE conducts compartment exams for the students who failed their class X board exams on the first attempt. The important guidelines regarding the compartment exam is as follows: The Board's policy of grace marks will be applied to those students who do not meet the qualifying criteria. If a student still does not pass, he will be placed in the 'Essential Repeat' or 'Compartment Category.' Exams for such students will be conducted internally by the school. A candidate can apply for only one or two-compartment exams. Students placed in the EIOP(Eligible for Improvement of Performance) category and who have appeared for the exam are eligible to give a compartment exam.
