Misfortune apparently falls on those who hold Christmas decorations a minute after the twelfth night - but can fall on 5 January or 6 January, according to different traditions. What are the rules to break down the tree and the tinsel? There is no precise date for the twelfth night, but marks the beginning of Epiphany on January 6, the Christian feast day when observers celebrate the visit to Jesus by the Magi - commonly known as the Three Kings, or the Men of Wise. The hashtag #Epiphany is trending on Twitter as those who bring down their decorations for another year share post-holiday blues. But others believe that the twelfth night marks the end of Christmas, which falls logically on January 5 if the 12 nights are counted by the Christmas night itself. To add to the confusion, while the Anglicans mark the twelfth night on January 5, other churches wait until the next day. The epiphany - also known as the Day of the Three Kings - remembers how the star led the wise to bear Jesus. The Church of England celebrates the Epiphany season from 6 January to 2 February. We are told that the wise men could have arrived many weeks later, but on January 6 traditionally it was a day of drinking and parade in Britain. The 17th century diarist Samuel Pepys remembers to fill his house with friends, "extraordinary Musick" and "good fires and candles" the day. The image of caption, the three wise men in crowds gathered in Madrid in Spain to celebrate the feast of Epiphany"and so to dance again, and sing, with extraordinary great pleasure, up to about two in the morning," he wrote on January 6, 1668. Another year, it was served 18 mince pies at a friend's Epiphany dinner. But as today, Pepys held that on January 6 he marked the final day of the celebrations. "This night, making a Christmas end," he wrote on January 6, 1663. More than 350 years later, many modern Britons would agree with him. Rev. Dr. Duncan MacLaren, accustomed to the BBC Radio Prayer 4 for the Day, explains: "The Epiphany recalls the visit of the Magi, who came to Jesus bringing gifts - gold and incense and myrrh." In Spain and Latin America, "El Día de los Reyes" is just as important as Christmas. The night before, the children leave a drink for the Three Kings and the streets are full of parades and fireworks. Swimming in icy water is a traditional way for Russian observers to celebrate Epiphany, which in the Eastern Churches falls on January 19 instead of January 6, because of the oldest Jewish calendar. For others, the coming of Epiphany means that decorations should come down before the clock hits midnight - January 5. Since December 25 is the first of the twelve days of Christmas according to the Anglican tradition, the twelfth night falls on this day. The twelfth night long marked the end of the Christmas season, to the extent that William Shakespeare intended his game of the same name to be played the day for this reason. That said, the first recorded performance of the twelfth night was February 2, the end of the Epiphany season, in Middle Temple Hall in London - within which last year's tree should be long gone.
